What will we be learning this Term?



Our learning topic is 'Water, Water Everywhere' and is centred around Science and Geography. We will focus on states of matter, alongside key aspects of rivers and the water cycle, including practical workshops! This will also link to our History learning of Ancient Egypt, including a focus on the River Nile and historical sources— how do we know about Ancient Egypt?

In English we will focus on poems with a structure, information booklets and stories with a theme. In Mathematics our key topics include place value, addition and subtraction, shape and time.



Our class 'bookworm' Wilbur, will also be going to different houses to be read to and reviews or reading activities can be completed in Wilbur's notebook.

What will Year 4 be doing over 2019-2020?

Below is a brief overview of the curriculum which Year 4 will be completing over the year.

Autumn 1st Half Term

Water, Water Everywhere

Science and Geography are the key leads in this topic, as we will focus on states of matter, alongside key aspects of rivers. This will also link to our History learning of Ancient Egypt, including the River Nile. This topic will be enhanced by working with the River Ribble Trust and a theatre trip.



Autumn 2nd Half Term

Sparks Might Fly



This theme is centred on Electricity and Design Technology. Our learning will be extended by using equipment and electrical components to make and debug simple circuits. We will also focus on Music, exploring, choosing, combining and organising musical ideas using or representing an electronic sound source.

Spring 1st Half Term

Passport to Europe

A Geography based theme in which we will explore contrasting regions within Europe. This will lead to a Design Technology focus, where we will be focusing on products for travellers. Listening to music from different cultures will also extend our learning within this theme, alongside our Year 3 and Year 4 production.



Spring 2nd Half Term

The Art of Food



A half term focused on Science and exploring the teeth and digestive system. This will be supported by practical activities in the classroom to model scientific processes. The topic will also be partnered with an Art and Design focus, including drawing and painting still life into sculpture.

Summer 1st Half Term

Hunted

A scientifically focused theme on habitats, including the grouping and classification of plants and animals. Design Technology will be a key element of this topic, focusing on food technology: simple savoury food and cooking techniques.



Summer 2nd Half Term

The Great Plague



A historical understanding of this time in 1665 will be developed, alongside Geography knowledge focused on rubbish and recycling. Art and Design will also be a key theme, where drawing will be developed into printmaking and using techniques involving rotating and translating images.
