### PSHE

As the nights draw in, the children will be learning how to keep themselves safe using the 'be bright, be seen' campaign and how to keep themselves safe around fireworks.



In addition, the children will continue to follow the 'My Happy Mind' scheme. This half term the children, will learn about character strengths and how they make us unique and special. We will be exploring the 5 character strengths including: love and kindness, bravery and honesty, exploring and learning, teamwork and friendship, love of Life and Our World.



### English

Our first unit in English, this half term, is poems on a theme. We will be reading a range of poems with the theme of fireworks. The children will learn to read and write words with the suffix -ed and continue to join words using the conjunction 'and' to join words. Later in the half term, the children will be writing information texts about The Great Fire of London and finally will be writing a short narrative based on the story with a repeated pattern Harvey Slumfenburger's Christmas present. During our handwriting lessons, we will be continuing to



learn to form lower case letters and their corresponding capital letters.. We have now begun Phase 5 in phonics and are continuing to follow the Lancashire's Red Rose phonics scheme. The children have begun to learn new graphemes for phonemes and we will continue to revisit these new graphemes throughout the year. This week has seen the introduction of split diagraphs.

### Mathematics

The mathematics units we are studying this half term are:

- Sequencing and sorting – counting in fives, counting in twos, odd and even numbers, recognise and create repeated patterns of number or shapes, sort shapes and numbers to a given criterion.
- Fractions – explore parts and wholes, finding fractions of 2D shapes, recognise and name one half and one quarter of a shape or object,
- Capacity and Volume – compare and describe a capacity or volume by using a range of language, measure and record capacity and volume using non-uniform stand units (cups).
- Money – recognise coins by colour, shape and size, order coins by value, represent an amount using coins, add two prices together.
- Time – days of the week and months of the year, compare the duration of two events, measure and compare time using seconds.

### Science

This half term, as we enter winter, we will be continuing to explore seasonal changes and observing the weather. We will notice how the trees continue to change and how the weather changes,. We will also observe the changes to the amount of daylight as the days become shorter and the night become longer.



### Music

This half term, the children will be taught music. They will be exploring keeping a pulse together through music and movement. They will Sway or tap in time to the pulse, sing a rhythm in time with the pulse and copy rhythms based on word patterns using an instrument.

### Religious Education



Our unit this half term is Christianity, linked to Jesus. The Children will begin by exploring how we look after babies and that all babies are special. They will learn the nativity story and will understand why Christians believe that Jesus is a special baby. We will look at religious traditions including the sending of Christmas cards and advent calendars as well as the meaning behind the giving and receiving of gifts.

### Art

**In Art, the children will be carrying out a drawing project. They will be observing and drawing fruit. They will explore using movement with their whole bodies to create interesting marks, look carefully at the pattern on the fruit using a viewfinder and create patterns using a range of drawing tools including ink.**



### History

In History, we will be learning about the significant event of The Great Fire of London. The children will be learning where people and events fit in chronological framework. They will learn to recognize the distinction between past and present sorting clothing, transport, building and people into past and present. After learning the story of The Great Fire of London, they will order significant events and investigate why the fire spread so quickly. They will look at a range of primary sources including extracts from Samuel Pepys diary to help them answer questions about the past. Finally, they will look at how life changed after The Great Fire.

### Physical Education

This half term the children will be developing their gymnastics skills. They will be learning to travel, jump and roll in a range of ways. The children will then use their skills to create their own simple routines. In addition, the children will continue to develop their fundamental motor skills focusing on the skill of kicking. Please make sure that pupils have a labelled PE kit in school including pumps/black trainers, shorts, t-shirt and a jacket.

### THINGS TO REMEMBER

**PE Days:** PE will continues to take place on Tuesdays and/or Thursdays

Home learning will consist of 1 piece of set homework linking to the curriculum, a piece of optional maths homework, spelling practise and reading practise linking to the new sounds the children are learning in phonics. **Reading:** Your child should read and discuss their reading book at least 3 x a week for at least 5-10 minutes. They will also receive key words and sounds linked to their phonics to practise at home. This will help them to improve their fluency and comprehension skills Please ensure home reading records and books are in school daily as we do also try to read with pupils as often as we can.
