PSHE – Here is what your child will be learning about this half term within the Engage unit of our My Happy Mind curriculum:

- We will be learning how we can use everything that you have learnt to feel good and do good.
- We will be learning when we feel good, we do good.
- We will learn how to set goals.
- We are learning how we can keep focused on our goals when things get tough.

English – We will be reading the story of Aladdin over the next 6 weeks, giving pupils lots of opportunities to show what they are capable of, with a revision of skills we have learnt over the year so far. Throughout the unit we will work towards several writing outcomes, including:

- Setting description
- Diary entries in role
- Poetry
- Persuasive letter
- Persuasive poster
- Narrative an additional chapter in the story

We will also be supporting our learning by watching clips of both the 1992 Aladdin film and the 2019 film. The 2019 version is a PG rating; if anyone has any concerns about us watching this in class, please let me know by Monday.

Mathematics – The key aspects of maths that we will focus on this half term are:

- Fractions Focussing on finding, recognising and problem solving with quarters.
- Time Telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes past on an analogue clock.
- Number and Place Value with Statistics Partitioning, Using greater than and less than signs, Ordering.
- Addition and Subtraction Addition and subtraction with exchange, using jottings and bar models



- Capacity and Volume Reading scales and comparing measurements using greater than and less than signs
- Temperature Understanding and comparing different temperatures
- Fractions Recognise, name, and find one third of shapes, objects and quantities.



Science – Our unit this half term focusses on Living Things. We will be exploring things that are living, dead and never been alive. We are hoping for lots of nice weather as we will be taking our Science learning outside to search for living things, identifying them and their habitats. We will also learn about simple food chains and give some examples of these.

Computing – During this half term we will be learning 'What is a computer?'. We will learn to recognise the parts and how they are controlled. We will explore different technologies and understand the role of computers in the world.





Religious Education – In R.E, the children will be looking at the religion of Christianity with a focus on the Church. They will explore the signs and symbols of Christianity and be able to describe the features of a church after visiting two different churches in Barnoldswick.

Art – Our Art unit this half term is Collage, and our end outcome is to produce some beach themed collage art. We will develop our skills by using different materials and tools to create different effects after being inspired by a trip to the beach on <u>Monday 19th</u> <u>May</u>! Please read, sign and return the letter detailing this exciting trip.





Physical Education- In PE, Year 2 will be working on our overarm throwing and striking skills in our Striking and Fielding Games unit. We will also be developing our rolling, jumping and travelling movements in our Gymnastics unit.

Geography - In Geography, we are studying daily and seasonal weather patterns in the UK. We will learn map symbols and geographical vocabulary when exploring weather and explain how weather can affect human activity.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

- **PE DAYS:** Laughing Owls have P.E on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons. Please make sure both indoor and outdoor PE kits are in school ready for our lessons and all kit has their name labelled/written in. <u>Please ensure earrings are removed on PE days</u>.
- **Reading**: Your child should be reading and discussing their reading book <u>at least</u> <u>3x a week for 5-10 minutes</u>. This will help them to improve their fluency and comprehension skills and help them to improve their writing skills.
