PSHE – Here is what your child will be learning about this half term:

- How to recognise risk and keep themselves safe in everyday situations and in familiar and unfamiliar environments.
- How to respond if there is an accident and someone is hurt and about whose job it is to keep us safe and how to get help in an emergency, including how to dial 999 and what to say.
- To identify and name the main parts of the body including external genitalia.
- About change as people grow up, including new opportunities and responsibilities.
- Preparing to move to a new class and setting goals for next year.



English

This half term we will be continuing our Aladdin unit, with a focus on writing a new narrative chapter, drawing on the vocabulary we have learnt last half term and using subordination for 'when'. We will then study poetry, linked to our trip last month to the beach, focussing on choosing and using new vocabulary, suffixes and adjectives to create their very own poem with a seaside theme. We will then move on to writing our own story with a beach theme based on a book read together, using apostrophes and suffixes.

Mathematics – The key aspects of maths that we will focus on this half term are:

- Time, Position and Direction – Telling the time to 5 minutes and clockwise/anti-clockwise.
- Geometry – Identifying lines of symmetry, sorting 2D and 3D shapes and sequence these.
- Mental Addition and Subtraction – Learning appropriate mental operations and strategies.
- Multiplication and Division – Understanding multiplication and division and solving problems.
- Statistics and Calculation – Interpreting data and constructing pictograms.
- Measurement – Comparing length, height and mass and solving problems.



Science – Our unit this half term focusses on Habitats. Pupils will be heading outdoors each week to explore different habitats and micro-habitats. They will discuss and learn how habitats are suited to certain living things and how habitats provide basic needs.

You will be invited into school to join us down at the allotment this half term. A letter will be sent out nearer the time with more details.

Computing – Our Computing unit teaches us all about programming. We will be exploring Scratch Jr, which is a programming and coding application. We will create animations using this software and using characters as buttons. Our learning will then develop on to following and creating an algorithm using code, using the three little pigs as a theme.



Religious Education – In R.E, the children will be looking at the religion of Judaism. They will be focussing on the importance of making time to spend with family and people who are special to them, linked to the Jewish Sabbath. They will be exploring Jewish beliefs and values and learning how Jewish people live in accordance with the Torah.

DT – This half term we will be learning sewing skills as part of our Textiles unit. We will use our new skills when designing, making and evaluating a small bag.



Physical Education- In PE, Year 2 will be taking part in an outdoor adventure unit. We will develop the skills of working as a team, navigating around the school grounds. We will also be completing end of key stage physical assessments by playing games, looking at throwing, running, kicking, catching, jumping, and hopping.



History - In History, we are studying the lives of significant people from the past, with a focus on sport. We will learn about the life and significance of Learie Constantine and compare him to present-day sportsman Marcus Rashford. We will use a range of sources to gather information and develop our ideas.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

- **PE DAYS:** Laughing Owls have P.E on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons. Please make sure outdoor PE kits are in school ready for our lessons and all kit has your child's name labelled/written in. Please ensure earrings are removed on PE days.
- **Reading:** Your child should be reading and discussing their reading book **at least 3x a week for 5-10 minutes.** This will help to improve their fluency and comprehension skills and help them to improve their writing skills.
