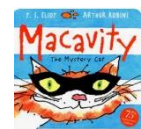
My Happy Mind and PSHE

This half term we will be working on the module called 'Engage'. This module focuses on setting goals and using everything we have learnt so far to feel good about ourselves and then to be able to 'do good'.

In PSHE we will be learning

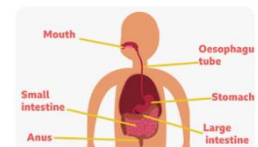
- about the elements of a balanced, healthy lifestyle
- about what good physical health means; how to recognise early signs of physical illness
- how to maintain good oral hygiene (including correct brushing and flossing); why regular visits to the dentist are essential; the impact of lifestyle choices on dental care (e.g. sugar consumption/acidic drinks such as fruit juices, smoothies and fruit teas; the effects of smoking)

English – In English this half term we will be studying Macavity the Mystery Cat. Looking at vocabulary, inferences about the characters, toolkits for performing poems, leading to writing and performing our own. We will also use the information we have collected to write a newspaper report based on the evidence gathered.



Mathematics – **During** this half term, we will be focusing on several different areas of maths. We will be working hard to learn all of our times tables. We will also focus on developing our fluency and accuracy when solving a range of mental and written strategies to solve addition, subtraction, multiplication and division calculations.

Science – This half term we will be learning about our digestive system. We will investigate the different types of teeth and their features. Our investigation skills will be put to the test to find out what can cause our teeth to decay. We will research the functions of the different parts of the digestive system, before making a model to explain the process of digestion.



Computing

This half term we will be following the KAPOW unit on HTML

We will recognise the role of HTML in a web page and altering the HTML to change the text and images.

Religious Education – In R.E, the children will be looking at the religion of Islam and focus on our key question: ‘Why do Muslims fast during Ramadan?’ During the topic, we will develop our understanding of the key values of Islam and consider the role of commitment as part of religious life.

DT– Our DT work will focus on pneumatics. We will explore existing products that use a pneumatic system and then create our own toys and monsters using this technique.



History- This half term we will be learning all about the Egyptians. We will be doing an in- depth study of the discovery of Tutankhamun by Howard Carter. We will use our History skills to make predictions and use sources to build up our knowledge of the importance of this significant event.



Physical Education – This half term we will we will focus on developing passing and shooting skills for invasion games. We will be learning how to become accurate when shooting at a target as part of a small team game. We will also be continuing our outdoor and adventurous learning throughout the summer term.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

- **PE DAYS** : Every Wednesday the children in Year 4 will need outdoor clothing to include a coat and sensible footwear for our outdoor and adventurous sessions. PE kits will be needed on a Thursday (indoor and out please).
- **Home Learning:** Home learning is set on Fridays and should be handed in by the following Thursday. Each week, your child will have spellings to practise, a x tables task and reading homework.
- **Reading:** Congo Bay Owls love reading! It is still vital that your child reads every day. Many children have made great progress in our reading challenge, with a home learning free week proving very popular. Please continue to encourage your child to read regularly. This will help them to improve their fluency and comprehension skills and will also help them to improve their writing skills.
