
PSHE – Here is what your child will be learning about this half term:

Money and work

- Know about jobs that people may have from different sectors e.g. teachers, business people, charity work
- Know that people can have more than one job at once or over their lifetime
- Know about common myths and gender stereotypes related to work
- Challenge stereotypes through examples of role models in different fields of work e.g. women in STEM
- Know about some of the skills needed to do a job, such as teamwork and decision-making
- Recognise their interests, skills and achievements and how these might link to future jobs
- Set goals that they would like to achieve this year e.g. learn a new hobby

Media literacy and digital resilience

- Know how the internet can be used positively
- Recognise that images and information online can be altered and reasons for this
- Know strategies to recognise whether something they see online is true or accurate
- Evaluate whether a game or website is suitable
- Make safe, reliable choices from search results
- Know how to report something seen or experienced online that concerns them



English - In English this half term we will be focusing on folk tales, with our class text being 'The Tin Forest' by Helen Ward, which can be viewed using the QR code. After exploring the key features, vocabulary and prepositions, we will then be writing our own folk tale base on the structure from the text.

Following this, we will be looking at biographies, including a range of print and film extracts from famous people, such as Walt Disney, David Beckham, Beatrix Potter and Roald Dahl. We will be focusing on key features and how specific information is organised within a biography and will then be writing our own biographies.



Mathematics - The key aspects of maths that we will focus on this half term are: 2-D shape, addition and subtraction, statistics, fractions and time. Things that you could practice at home are: telling the time to the nearest minute (digital and analogue); addition and subtraction facts (number bonds) and multiplication and division facts for the 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 times tables. We will be focusing on our 8s soon!

Science – This half term we will continue to explore light. We will focus on shadows, including how they are formed and finding patterns in the way that the size of shadows change. We will have lots of opportunities to explore practically, including drawing around our own shadows, observing sundials and making and using puppets.

Computing – During this half term, we will continue to focus on computing systems and networks, with our unit called 'Journey Inside a Computer'. We will gain an understanding of how computers work, including using inputs and outputs, and use this knowledge to create a paper version of computer parts and identifying similarities and differences between various models.

Religious Education – In R.E. the children will be looking at the religion of Christianity and the key question: What do Christians mean by the 'Holy Spirit'? Key learning will include the story of Pentecost, fruits of the Spirit, and then personal reflection as they consider their own special qualities and talents.





Design Technology – This half term our focus is on shell and frame structures, which we will be exploring and then putting into practise when we design and create our own mini greenhouses. We will be thinking about how these can be adapted for our use and explore different ways to strengthen our frames, including using diagonal structs

Physical Education – Burrowing Owls have P.E on Mondays and Wednesdays. On Mondays, we will be focusing on invasion skills, within the game of netball. These sessions will be outdoors, weather permitting. On Wednesdays, we will be focusing on dance, within the theme 'rock and roll'.

History – The Roman invasion of Britain was hugely significant in shaping the British nation. The learning within this theme focuses on the settlement in Britain by Romans, and the impact on British life and society that occurred as a result of this. We will learn about significant figures in history, such as Boudicca, learn how to tell the difference between a legionary and an auxiliary soldier and we will also be having a workshop run by 'Marcus, the Roman soldier' and borrowing two boxes of artefacts to make our History learning hands on!

Modern Foreign Languages – We will be continuing our French learning, including counting to ten and saying our age. This 'All About Me' unit will also focus on following basic instructions, identifying colours and items of clothing. We will be doing lots of speaking and listening, in addition to learning some songs in French.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

PE Days: We will be doing PE on Mondays and Wednesdays. PE kits should stay in school all week.
